

Manuscript Evaluation – Peer Review

Manuscripts that meet the formatting requirements will be forwarded to the Scientific Editors of RBGG and then to selected ad hoc reviewers.

To be published, the manuscript must be approved in the following phases:

1 - Pre-analysis (Screening): The manuscript evaluation is carried out by the Scientific Editors, based on objective items. [Click here to access the screening criteria.](#)

2 - External peer review: Manuscripts selected in the pre-analysis are submitted for evaluation by specialists in the subject area.

The reviews are analyzed by the editors, who will also assess the originality, pertinence, academic quality, and relevance of the manuscript to the fields of Geriatrics and Gerontology. The final decision on whether or not to publish the manuscript rests with the editors.

3 - Final analysis: The phase in which the author makes the necessary adjustments for the publication of the article. In this editing and standardization process, the Journal reserves the right to make formal, orthographic, or grammatical changes to the text before forwarding it for publication.

The final decision on whether or not to publish the manuscript always rests with the Editors of RBGG.

We remind you that the anonymity of the authors is guaranteed throughout the entire article review process.
